Requirements

- Completion of a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution with an overall GPA 3.0 or higher and no grade lower than a C for prerequisite courses
- Two letters of recommendation
- Completion of the GRE within the last five years.
- Discernment into the profession, such as health care experience/patient contact
- Prerequisite coursework taken at a regionally accredited U.S. college or university or equivalent
