Re: request for change of authorizer

Dear Ms. Omlor:

Career Academy of South Bend requests that Trine become its authorizer as soon as possible.

Reason For Change. While our charter agreement with Ball State University does not expire until 6/30/2016, we would like to make changes before then which BSU is apparently unwilling to approve. First, we want to divide, effective immediately, into a high school (grades 9-12) and middle school (grades 5-8), to conform to how public schools in St. Joseph County are organized and to establish a more independent identity for our middle school. Second, we want to establish independent primary (K-4) schools at three locations in South Bend opening in Fall of 2015 and an additional two K-4 schools opening in Fall of 2016. These changes are integral to our overall goals:

- To offer the children in St Joseph County (particularly the west side of South Bend) an
 opportunity to have a positive school experience and an excellent relevant education.
- To counter the "skills mismatch" between young people and local employers by preparing young people with the job skills and character traits necessary for success in high-skill, high-pay jobs that will strengthen South Bend's economy.
- To demonstrate that a school can be successful both by academic standards and in its
 practical effect on student lives for students from relatively disadvantaged backgrounds.
- To positively impact the South Bend Community School Corporation by serving as a model of how schools can be improved.

<u>Good Academic Standing</u>. The Career Academy has had significant academic improvement over its first three years of operation, but the reality of urban charter schools is that students generally start at well below grade level, resulting in low passing rates. Students arriving at the Career Academy typically are at reading and math proficiency levels two or three years behind, reflecting

conditions in the South Bend Community School Corporation schools.¹ As shown by the IDOE COMPASS website, http://compass.doe.in.gov/dashboard/istep.aspx?type=school&id=7564, the Career Academy's ISTEP passing rates are still unacceptably low, but passing rates have improved significantly in each year of operation, and the 11.8% improvement in 2013-14 is one of the highest rates of improvement among Indiana schools.² The Career Academy expects substantial additional improvement in the future, and has taken measures to that end such as the hiring of experienced "master teachers" and the implementation of improved teaching methods as detailed in the Student Achievement Plan submitted to the IDOE and BSU in March, 2014.

<u>Financial Health</u>. The Career Academy's income (primarily state tuition revenue) has not met its expenses in its first three years of operation, nor will it do so for 2014-15. High schools are expensive to operate, especially with vocational programs and project-based learning (including extensive Project Lead The Way courses). Fortunately, the Career Academy is supported by the Garatoni Family Foundation, a major private foundation in St. Joseph County. The school plans to increase its operating income to meet its expenses by the following steps:

- In the fall of 2015, open three K-4 schools on the west side of South Bend with a total enrollment of 375 children, and in the fall of 2016, open two more K-4 schools, resulting in total K-4 enrollment of 600 students. In addition to education benefits, these K-4 schools will have financial benefits (for all school systems, elementary schools are less expensive to run, and state tuition is higher in comparison to expenses).
- Increase enrollment in grades 5 through 8 to 600 students and increase enrollment in grades 9-12 to 600 students. Aside from the fact that lower grades are less expensive, the increased scale will better cover the school's fixed expenses.

While we cannot document that BSU considers us in good financial standing, BSU's confidence in our financial strength is demonstrated by BSU having asked us to take over another charter school which is experiencing financial problems.

<u>Compliance With Laws And Charter</u>. Neither the IDOE nor BSU have informed the Career Academy of any non-compliance with federal or state law or the existing charter agreement.
